Local Government Elections 2010

There are some neighbourhoods in Gisborne (like parts of Kaiti) where voting for Council is less than half of other areas (like Whataupoko).

The needs and interests of Kaiti residents don't get a fair go at Council - year after year Ka Pai Kaiti presents options and ideas during planning processes that get ignored.

Kaiti residents and what is important to us needs to be better represented at local government level. We need to get behind candidates who care about Kaiti in the local body elections later this year.

So, make sure you are on the electoral roll and your address is up to date (phone 0800 36 76 56 if you're not sure). And use your vote vote wisely - living in the city ward we get up to 8 votes for Council candidates - but if you use all 8 ticks you might be bumping off the one or two candidates that you really want to see on Council.

Council affects a lot of our life - how much we pay in rent or rates, whether or not we will pay for our drinking water, where pools and parks are located, free internet at the library, how much it costs to put out the rubbish and much more.
